

Douglas Whitfield's Gallery



I paint full time in my studio at Cedar Lake in upstate New York. Occasionally I practice my avocation which is teaching artists how creativity relates to physiological brain theory. I have been represented by fine art galleries around the world since 1967.

My medium is oil paint on canvas. My subjects are people. My purpose is to arouse the viewer's limbic: his passion. My canvasses are filled with a sense of love, humor, titillating glances and touches between the subjects that belie a relation-

ship (to be defined by the viewer.) All of my giclées are output, in very small editions, on an Epson 10600 printer, using archival inks on the finest canvas in the fine art world. Each is hand signed and numbered with a final satin application coating to complete my composition.

My compositions are dreamlike. My characters are like players in a fantastic theater. They gesture dramatically and strike theatrical poses on their stage. They seem cognizant of the observer and present themselves for the viewer's pleasure. The life of my paintings is in the imagination of the viewer.

Please take time to study my work. If the urge to purchase nudges you, that's OK too.

Background and Technique



Born in Cleveland, Ohio in 1945. Douglas spends equal time creating his unique vision in oils and teaching art and physiological brain theory as it applies to learning, insight, and creativity. Cleveland Plain Dealer's art editor describes Whitfield's paintings as "haunting, provocative, always arousing the limbic."

Whitfield studied at the Cleveland Institute of Art and Rochester Institute of Technology, receiving his BFA in 1968.

Whitfield's paintings gained recognition throughout the South West

for the modern sensibility that they brought to the traditional folk history of the region, and his work has been widely published. In the early seventies, Whitfield's study of the old masters brought him new recognition in Europe, as an artist who depicted post Freudian visions in a stunning contemporary manner. Whitfield has won numerous awards and distinctions in art competitions throughout the world. He has had *seventeen* one man shows, and is represented in galleries in many major cities including New York and London.

Today, Whitfield's paintings are in private collections throughout the United States and Europe. He is in many collections in the Los Angeles area, where he represented the vanishing species for the Guild of American Screen Actors benefit. Many people throughout Texas have found Douglas' work worthy of adding to their fine art collections. In fact, former governor of Texas, Ann Richards, is one of Whitfield's patrons.

Whitfield resides in Cedar Lake, New York with his wife, Franca.
